

Pastoral Support

At Newbottle and Charlton CEVA Primary School we consider good mental health and wellbeing to be fundamentally important and are committed to supporting the emotional health and wellbeing of all the pupils, their families and members of staff and governors. We believe it is vital that all members of our school community know how to look after their mental health and support their wellbeing and that we all have a part to play in supporting each other to do this. At our school we are:

- Building a culture where people feel comfortable talking about mental health.
- Help children to understand their emotions and feelings better and learn how they can self-regulate themselves
- Help all stakeholders to feel comfortable sharing any concerns or worries
- Help children socially to form and maintain relationships
- Encourage children to be confident and 'dare to be different'
- Help children to develop self confidence, emotional resilience and to manage setbacks
- Support children with social, emotional barriers through providing specific interventions and support
- We offer different levels of support for children in school and have a designated Emotional literacy support assistant who supports children and staff
