

Children have continued to work hard in school on their topics and it was lovely as always to see the different learning going on at home. In the news recently there has been lots of coverage of the 'Black Lives Matter' movement and today each class explored this in their age appropriate way during our class assembly time. The reception bubble theme was -everyone is special and unique. Year 1 and the keyworker bubbles discussed- Standing up for Others. While Year 6 went a little deeper and discussed what racism is and reflected on how change can happen in the world. #### What has been going on in the 'Four Kingdoms of School' this week?



In Oaken this week we have been developing our own book characters — we've had some very imaginative ones! There have been sausages wearing ear

muffs, zoo keepers, naughty boys and burger loving aliens! We are also observing how a bean grows – we are talking to our beans every day to see if it helps them to grow quicker.



This week Ashrelia has been a very busy kingdom and have been learning about arrays, columns and rows... all leading to thinking in 2s, 5s and 10s and multiplication. Our reading book has been Owl Babies and we have been thinking of lots of questions that the baby owls could

have been asking. We have learnt about The Qur'an and how it was revealed to the prophet Mohammad. We have also read The Paper Bag Princess and imagined what the dragon would look like if he had looked in through a window at us!



In "The Mysterious Kingdom of Elmbottle' this week we have been learning about Alexander Graham Bell and his part in the invention of the telephone, we also had a look at some videos of the earliest telephones and how an old telephone exchange used to work!

We also worked altogether on one of the Real PE home challenges, everyone was getting pretty good at balancing on one leg whilst trying difficult challenges by the end!



This week in Birchleyville we have continued to write our Greek myths and created some gruesome similes to describe our characters! We have tackled pie charts in maths and learnt about the different types of Ancient Greek government. This led us to explore democracy and the Suffragette movement, too. We learnt about Archimedes and his "Eureka!"

moment before investigating buoyancy for ourselves.
















